

IDA Team Receives 2019 DHS Under Secretary's Award

ALEXANDRIA, VA (January 2020) – The Institute for Defense Analyses' (IDA's) Support Anti-Terrorism by Fostering Effective Technologies Act (SAFETY Act) project received a 2019 Department of Homeland Security (DHS) Under Secretary of Science and Technology (S&T) special achievement award on December 6, 2019.

"This award recognizes the value of IDA's independent, objective, and rigorous analyses in the evaluation of anti-terrorism technologies," said IDA research staff member Laura Itle, Ph.D. who accepted the award on behalf of the IDA team. Since the task started in 2003, IDA has received the award previously in 2007, 2012, and 2014.
